Monuwar remains in the house with an Afghani family where she feels comfortable. She and Kobra both attend ESL classes all day and work in restaurants in the evening. All hard working, lovely young women.

  - Monuwar is remaining in the house near Grandview and Bloor with an Afghani family and continues with work and school.

We have been asked by the SSAO (Seniors for Social Action Ontario) to lend our name to a media campaign whose goal is to end the mass institutionalization of older adults and promote direct funding along with in-home and community-based alternatives and promote a system that costs less, is more sustainable for future generations and gives people options. The Ads will be professionally done, there is no cost to the signatories and our board will get to see the Ad. This is a women's issue as they make up the bulk of caregivers and seniors and they often live in poverty in their older years.
