

WHAT HAS AN IMPACT?

Over the months we have shared much information from SSAO and asked you to support our advocacy with the government. Dr. Trish Spindel shared this on the SSAO face book page.

People have a lot of different ideas on how to get governments moving on issues of concern, but many are completely pointless and government likes it that way.

Petitions are a perfect example. They simply don't work and take a lot of time and energy. Demonstrations at Queen's Park are another. At most you can get one day of news coverage for a lot of effort. Sitting on Facebook or other social media and complaining to like-minded people has no impact on public policy at all and just allows people to vent, which can feel better, but it does not accomplish anything.

Here is what does work.

Keeping the heat on MPPs irrespective of whether or not they respond - write e-mails to them, call them, and demand meetings with them. If MPPs get a lot of calls or e-mails about a particular topic, they will raise it in their party caucuses.

Writing letters to the editor of local and national newspapers. A lot of people read letters to the editor, so it is a good way to influence public opinion. Politicians also have clipping services that keep track of letters, so when they see a lot on a particular issue they take notice.

Forging good relationships with reporters so they call on you for comment or ask you to appear on TV.

Establishing a local group of ''troublemakers'' who join together to write letters, call MPPs and get others to do so.

Organizing on-line events in your areas and inviting key speakers, politicians, senior civil servants, representatives from local Home and Community Care Support Services, etc. bring the policy makers and service providers face to face with the people they are supposed to serve. That creates instant accountability.

Partnering with other local, regional, and provincial groups and organizing letter writing campaigns. The more people who write to the Premier, copied to his Chief of Staff and to Ministers, copied to their Chiefs of Staff the better. SSAO leadership cannot bring about change alone. It takes local and provincial effort to bring about change and we need all of your help in that.


