

Speaker Series at Ontario Council: March 2, 2019

The keynote speaker was Yaelle Gang from *Equal Voice*, a non-partisan, national and bilingual organization founded in 2001 to promote the election of more women at the various levels of government. Did you know that:

- 39 % of MPPs are women in the Ontario Legislature
- 17% of mayors in Ontario are female
- 34% MPs from Ontario in Ottawa are women
- Quebec is the first province to elect over 40% women in the last election in the fall
- Vancouver City Council is made up of 3 men and 8 women

Many women do not run as a candidate due to the following reasons:

- 1. Large time commitment 2. Family obligations
 - nt 2. Family obligations 3. Financial cost
 - 4. Not enough skills
- 5. Life in the public eye

The second speaker was Hafsah Asadullah, a student from U of T, who participated in the *Daughter of the Vote* conference in Ottawa in 2017. This is a program supported by the Status of Women Canada who bring 18-23 year old women from each riding to Ottawa to communicate their vision for Canada. *Hedy G*.

Lorraine V. introduced our speaker, Leigh Naturkach, whose topic was *Talking About Death Won't Kill You*. Leigh was thanked by Hedy.

Hedy called the business meeting to order at 8:45 pm.

- 1. **Motion**: Mary K., Dorothy W.: to accept **the minutes** of the January 9, 2019 general meeting as printed and circulated. **Carried**. There was no February meeting due to bad weather.
- 2. **Treasurer's Report**: Hedy reported a balance of \$3463.44 in the general fund. The balance in the scholarship trust fund is \$925.18. **Motion**: Hedy G., Janet B.: to accept the treasurer's report. **Carried**.

3. Ontario Council

- a) Hedy reported on the Speaker Seminar, *Women Helping Women*, which she attended on March 2. The topics were women in politics (speaker from Equal Voice) and the self-image of women and girls.
- b) Finalized registration forms for the OC AGM, May 10-11, *Helping Women on the Margins through Education*, are available. They have been emailed to the membership. Registration deadline is April 16, 2019.
- c) There have been some OC by-law changes to conform to the Ontario Not for Profit Corporation Act.

4. National News

- a) Eighteen Canadian delegates travelled to attend the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women this month. The focus was on gender equality and empowerment of women and girls.
- b) International Women's Day 2019 fund raising: CFUW is supporting *Justice for Women in Antioquia, Colombia*, partnering with Inter Pares to support litigation for women and girls who were victims of sexual and gender based violence. Donations accepted until June 1.
- c) There was an amendment to the Articles and Bylaws: to replace the terms "Member at Large" and "Club at Large" with E-Member and E-Club.

5. Committee Reports

- a) **Advocacy**: Mary K. attended the UOIT donor recognition dinner at Bistro 67 on March 4 Our recipient, Claryssa Zimmerman, was unable to attend, but will be invited to come to our AGM in May..
 - There are no national resolutions this year, but we have been asked to consider issues in order to form new ones for the future. Our advocacy committee has set the following priorities: the economy, health care/pharma care, immigration and climate. They have a sub-committee exploring how we can best be involved in the fall federal election campaign.
- b) **Membership**: Janet N. asked for three volunteers to work on the Nominating Committee with her and Sheila S. They are Elaine L., Lorraine V. and Jo-anne T.
- c) **Interest Groups**: The next *Let's Do Lunch* will be at The Greek Tycoon, Whitby at 12:30 pm on Friday, March 29. Contact Jone W. (not Catherine R.).
- d) **Christmas Dinner**: Elaine L. has researched Oshawa Golf Club. They are accessible. The ticket price would vary depending on meal choice.
- e) **Scholarship**: Donna H. reported that UOIT will award two bursaries for us of \$2250 each this year. In the last reporting period, \$600 was donated by our members. Value of the fund is in excess of \$152,000.
 - Durham College will give one award of \$1,500 this year. Donations from our members totalled \$1,850. Value of that fund is in excess of \$55,500.
 - **Motion**: Donna H., JoAnne P.: That \$1000 of the money raised from the April 14, 2019 fashion show be directed to a one time CFUW 100th Anniversary award for a female student at Durham College who is in STEM, trades or renewable technology programs. A major criterion will be financial need. **Carried**.
- f) **Program**: Janet B. announced that, at our April meeting, we will welcome Marjorie Mason who will speak on *Gardens around the World*.
- g) **Ways and Means**: Only eleven tickets remain for the fashion show. There are six models, all CFUW members. Several good door prizes have been promised. The next committee meeting will be on March 21.
