Sheila Smyth read the land acknowledgement and welcomed members and guests. Guests were invited to stay for refreshments following the speaker and also the business meeting if they wished. Attendance: 22 guests and 15 members.

Dianne Hunchak introduced the speaker, Steve Burrows, the author of the Birder Murder mystery series. He gave an interesting talk accompanied by a sophisticated slideshow on his writing and the extensive research he has done for each book. His ninth book in the series will be released next month.
