November 25th, 2023 <u>INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE:</u> ONTARIO'S UNACKNOWLEDGED EPIDEMIC AND ITS IMPACT ON WOMEN AND CHILDREN

Erin Lee from Interval House (Carleton Place) and the impetus behind Lanark County being the first in Ontario to declare intimate partner violence (IPV) an epidemic (following the **Culleton, Kuzyk & Warmerdam** (CKW) inquest report and recommendations) and **Pam Cross**, Advocacy Director Luke's Place, will be members of the panel. They will be presenting statistics on IPV in Ontario, discussing the social and legal issues of this scourge and addressing the impact of the CKW and Mass Casualty reports. This session will be chaired by <u>Sandra Shaw</u>, OC Chair, Advocacy.

November 25th is also the first of the Sixteen Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence and the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. In addition to bringing IPV as an epidemic in Ontario (and elsewhere) to the attention of our members, we have chosen this day for the launch of the OC *IPV as An Epidemic Toolkit*.
