Your executive has been busy and you will find a wealth of information about plans for 2019/2020 in this newsletter.

Our Program Committee has an excellent line up of speakers. Our interest group co-ordinator will be busy at the September meeting with sign up sheets for all the interest options. A membership committee is planning a number of ways to connect with potential members – probably the most effective of which is asking people to invite at least one friend to our opening meeting. Advocacy has met and will report on their plans.

Highlights from the CFUW National Annual General Meeting this summer Include:

- A Parks Canada plaque celebrating CFUW's 100th anniversary was unveiled in Ottawa
- The motion to make membership in Graduate Women International optional was defeated
- There will be an increase in CFUW fees from \$70 to \$76 per member next year
- An increase in the amount paid to GWI was not approved
- The 2020 AGM will be in Ottawa
- A memorandum of understanding with GWI was approved.

GWI is "the only international NGO for women by women with members in all continents focusing on education to empower women up to the highest levels." Their report to the triennial conference this summer is extensive. A tremendous amount of work has been done re women's education, governance and fiscal planning. There will be no GWI fee increase this year (but likely one in 2022). Instead CFUW has agreed to increase their "in-kind" contributions to GWI in the areas of advocacy, research and project development.

And last but definitely not least, this is the year we will celebrate a milestone of our own. The 75th Anniversary committee is working on plans to celebrate our club's presence in the Oshawa area over the last 75 years. So much has been done: so much has changed: so much remains as challenges for women and girls. You are all part of that history, that change and the possibilities for the future. Come and celebrate with us in April 25, 2020. Details to follow. So...we look forward to the challenges, opportunities and good times this year.
